About the Ocean Grove Surf Life Saving Club

Ocean Grove Surf Life Saving Club is situated on the main beach at Ocean Grove, Victoria, part of a 10 kilometre stretch of sand from "The Rip" at Point Lonsdale to the Barwon River mouth at Barwon Heads.

The surf club was formed in 1948 to keep the aquatic environment safe and educate the public about safe beach behaviour. The club has maintained consistent patrols on the beach for 75 years. In season 2022/23 the club had a membership of nearly 3000 members of which 500 are active in the club providing lifesaving services, programs and activities.

Approximately 450 are junior or "nipper" members. The club's large junior ranks provide a strong foundation for its patrol and competition activities as well as giving the club a family orientation with an active social calendar.

About the Nipper program

The Junior Nipper development program is a national program endorsed by Surf Life Saving Australia. It is specifically structured for children between the ages of 7 and 13. The primary goal of the Nipper program is to build the capacity in our kids and families to keep the beach safe and to educate its members and the general public on beach safety. The Nipper Program contributes greatly to the Club's Mission Statement, with the majority of our current patrolling members having started their life saving journey through the Nipper program.

The program is designed to develop essential surf skills, boost confidence and train nippers to become the future surf life savers and patrolling members of OGSLSC. Running across three different streams, OGSLC offers a Core Sunday Nipper Program, Surf Sports Program and the Summer Intensive Surf Education Program. The program provides opportunities for nippers to test their skills in club based events such as Club Championships and mini carnivals, along with Lifesaving Victoria endorsed carnivals culminating in the Victorian Junior State Championships.

Purpose of the position

To support the Junior Activities Committee with some basic administration tasks for the 2023/24 Nipper season. Due to the new restructure of the volunteer positions within the Nipper Program this role will only have a small weekly time commitment attached to it compared to previous seasons.

Primary responsibilities:

- **Attendance at** Junior Activities Committee Meetings, taking Minutes and preparing Agendas
- Email, phone and What's App communication with the Junior Activities Committee members
- Email, What's App and Team App communication with OGSLC Nipper Coaching Group and parents cohort
- Some email communication with LSV and OGSLC administration when required
- Basic spreadsheet and information recording
- Assistance with tasks on request from the Junior Activities Committee
- Support to the Nippers Carnival Entry Administrator if required

Core skills / experience:
